

Clackamas Free Clinic (CFC) is a volunteer-driven, non-profit, non-sectarian, primary and vision care clinic serving low-income, uninsured adults in Clackamas County. Located on the Oregon City campus of Clackamas Community College, we work to advance community health by providing access to health services.

CFC is looking for a mission-driven, motivated, and enthusiastic team player to join our core staff as part-time lead for our vision clinic. This .25 FTE (8-10 hours/week) position would provide consistency to our small vision clinic by treating patients and helping to recruit, onboard and guide our volunteer optometry workforce.

Our clinic primarily serves a low wage working population, and partners closely with the Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation to provide glasses at cost to our patients. Our top two clinic diagnoses include diabetes and hypertension and none of our patients have the resources to pay for vision care. Our vision clinic closed during the pandemic, and we are seeking to bring back this important service.

The successful candidate will direct and provide outpatient optometric care to clinic patients and liaise with our network of other community eye care providers to ensure comprehensive follow-up care.

The position includes:

- Participation in quality assurance, quality improvement and utilization review
- Patient examinations to detect signs of injury, disease, abnormality, or vision defects
- Examining eyes and fits spectacles provided through the Lion's Sight and Hearing Foundation
- Writing referral communications to doctors
- Reading retinal scans
- Prescribing medicines for eye conditions
- Collaborating with Operations Director to recruit optometry and optometry assistant volunteers.
- Working with Family Nurse Practitioner to develop protocols and procedures to ensure integrated eye care for clinic patients
- Participating in utilization and peer review programs which evaluates the quality of the optometry staff and services being performed at the clinic

Minimum Qualifications:

- Qualified to practice optometry under Oregon Revised Statute Chapter 683, in good standing
- At least five years of experience practicing optometry
- Current CPR certification
- Bilingual English/Spanish preferred
- Experience/familiarity with Electronic Medical Records systems, NextGen preferred

- Collaborative team player
- Passion for healthcare access
